


PAPER WEAVING

GRADES PK+

MATERIALS

- Different colored paper
- Scissors
- Ruler
- Pen or Pencil
- Optional: craft cutting mat, hobby knife or razor blade, paper cutter





Allow children to learn the basic weave pattern. Watch how they construct their understanding of visible and hidden paper sections.



Scan the QR code or search "<u>Simple Paper Weaving</u>" on YouTube to watch the instructional video. After creating the basic weave pattern, change



different variables like the size of both vertical and horizontal strips to create different patterns.



During and after the making of the circular weaving, reflect in the patterns children notice, vocabulary connected to the parts of the circle, and in other examples of weaving.

KEY CONCEPTS

Patterns

Different repeating patterns can create unique designs.

Geometry

Various geometric concepts like shapes, angles, and different types of symmetry.

Spatial Reasoning

Relational vocabulary (over, under, above, below, right, left, etc.).

Art

Concepts of color, shape, use of different materials.

OUESTIONS TO ASK

- What are some other materials that can be woven?
- How might you change the weave pattern?
- What do you notice about how the shape of the strips can change the pattern?
- Where do you see weaving in your world?
